

- 1. Docks: platforms built on the shore or out from the shore; wharves; piers
- 2. Migrating: going from one region to another with the change in seasons
- 3. Scan: to glance at; look over hastily
- 4. Scent: smell
- 5. Wharf: platform built on the shore or out from the shore beside which ships can load or unload
- 6. Yearned: felt a longing or desire
- 7. Nanih Waiya: The place where Chickasaw and Choctaw are believed to have split and gone different directions. Means "hill of beginnings".
- 8. council: a group of people who help the village leaders to decide on laws and other important matters.
- 9. reservation: land set aside by the United States government for American Indians.

Science Vocabulary

- 1. Weather- the condition of the atmosphere at a particular time and place; it changes day to day
- 2. Climate- the average weather condition of a particular region; this is the average over years
- 3. Humidity- amount of water vapor in the air
- 4. Air pressure weight of the air pressing down on earth
- 5. Temperature- degrees warm or cold
- 6. Precipitation- form of water that falls from a cloud to Earth
- 7. Anemometer- an instrument used to measure wind speed
- 8. Thermometer- an instrument used to measure temperature
- 9. Hygrometer- an instrument used to measure humidity
- 10. Wind vane- an instrument used to show the direction of the wind
- 11. Barometer- an instrument used to measure atmospheric pressure
- 12. Rain gauge- an instrument used to measure rain
- 13. Cumulus clouds- puffy clouds/cotton ball looking clouds; they are at middle to high altitude; develop during fair weather
- 14. Stratus clouds- flat/hazy clouds; they are at a low altitude; these can cause a light drizzle and small amount of snow
- 15. Nimbus clouds- these are black storm clouds; very tall; cause thunderstorms; wind, hail and rain
- 16. Cirrus clouds- thin wispy looking clouds; responsible for beautiful sunsets; high altitude
- 17. Meteorologists- an expert on the weather; a forecaster
- 18. Forecast- a prediction or estimate of future events especially coming weather
- 19. Front- large body of air that has similar moisture (density) and temperature characteristics. A front is a transition zone between two air masses.
- 20. Atmosphere- the envelope of gases surrounding the earth or another plane
- 21. Solar- relating to or denoting energy derived from the sun's rays
- 22. Drought-a prolonged period of abnormally low rainfall. Leading to a shortage of water
