

Vocabulary Words – Unit 7

•<u>accuse</u> – to say that someone or something has done wrong; blame

•<u>clever</u> – having or showing a quick mind; bright, smart (opposite – dumb)

•<u>coast</u> – the land near the sea or ocean, seashore; to move along without any power or effort

•<u>delicate</u> – easily broken or damaged; requiring care or skill (opposite – sturdy)

•<u>explore</u> – to travel; to discover; to look into or study something; investigate

<u>imitate</u> – to copy someone's movements or expressions; to appear like something else; mimic
<u>pierce</u> – to make a hole or opening; to run into or through something, as with a pointed tool or weapon; stab

•<u>rare</u> – not often found, seen, or happening; usually valuable or good; not fully cooked (opposite – common)

•<u>symbol</u> – something that stands for something else; a written sign that is used to represent something in math; sign

<u>*triumph</u> – an important win; a feeling of happiness that come from winning (opposite – defeat)
