- 1. vertebrate an animal with a backbone (Example: rabbits, snakes, frogs, horses, sparrow (birds), humans
- 2. spine another name for a backbone
- 3. invertebrate an animal without a backbone (Example: worm, crab, jellyfish, bee)
- 4. mammal a warm-blooded organism with hair or fur, has milk, and gives birth to live babies (Example: lions, cats, humans, horses)
- 5. reptile a cold-blooded organism with scaly skin (dry and rough), no milk, and babies hatch from eggs. (Example: snakes, crocodiles, turtles, alligators)
- 6, amphibian a cold-blooded organism with smooth skin, no milk, and babies hatch from eggs (Example: frogs, fish, salamander, lizards)
- 7. warm-blooded an organism whose body temperature stays the same (Example: humans, dolphins, whales, squirrels, elephants, birds)
- 8. cold-blooded an organism whose body temperature changes (Example: fish, snake, frog, alligator, crocodile)
